# Minutes of FCCA Meeting- Monday 24th April 2017.

- 1. APOLOGIES: Tony Parry, Phyllis Crawford, Derek Pilgrim, Andrea Cohen, Mave Hall, John & Jan Lidstone
- 2. MINUTES of the meeting on 20<sup>th</sup> March approved (signed as an accurate record)
- 3. MATTERS ARISING.
- a) Saltash Community Flood Forum. Nothing further to report.
- b) Defibrillator ... Tony has asked the local 'First Responder' to come to the May meeting to give an overview of the costs and requirements: if we go ahead and get one, it will need an electrical power supply, and will need to be mounted in a prominent position in the village ... suggestions welcomed.
- c) Repairs/surfacing of path on east side of creek ... nothing to report
- d) Sea wall repairs ... nothing to report.
- f) Replanting of area at head of creek (east side). Marty Vincent explained that the area in question was planted some 20 years ago on completion of the culvert but has now become a problem with maintenance and overgrowth. There is also a drain under the road which has collapsed. Her request was twofold ... first for permission to remove the existing vegetation (which may well be necessary anyway for repairs to the drain) and then to position low maintenance planters, probably on a gravel bed to promote natural drainage/soakaway. She would welcome physical assistance. Proposal broadly supported, volunteers for a working party requested. Jenny commented that the shrubs close to the village seat on the west side need cutting back too.
- g) Commemorative seat in Orchard. The Miller family would like to erect the seat in June: they are happy with the location suggested (close to the service road overlooking, and within the boundaries of, the orchard: material will be brown or dark green plastic made from recycled polythene bag material, so maintenance free). Any comments/observations should be addressed to Roger, not John Miller.

5. MOORING OFFICER'S REPORT. Moorings invoices for 2017/18 are going out ... 2/3 done. Three applications have been received from residents, apart from our usual waiting list; hopefully these will be allocated shortly.

Moorings licencees are reminded that they are required to keep their craft and moorings in good order: several boats are in poor, neglected condition. Boat owners are asked to remove seaweed from their mooring lines regularly, to prevent the lines floating and becoming a hazard to other boats entering and leaving moorings.

6. NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH. Two boats damaged at Cargreen. Usual warnings about locking sheds, garages, boats, outboards, equipment and vehicles ... there has been a recent spate of thefts from vehicles.

POST MEETING NOTE: On Tuesday night (25/04) the FCCA hall was broken into, and our PA equipment stolen: the glass in the south door was broken and the door opened using the manual 'fire escape' knob. This has now been changed for a key lock, so new 'fire escape' procedures will have to be followed

REMINDER: Hopper service to Derriford is currently not attracting enough passengers to make it viable long term: it will continue for the time being, albeit with timetable adjustments. Tree work in Conservation Areas ... Roger reminded the meeting that there are strict rules regarding any cutting work on trees whose trunk is more than 75mm (3") in diameter at a point 1.5m (5ft) above ground level. Members are advised to follow the correct procedure (and if in doubt, contact the Council) before doing any trimming of such trees (there is the risk of a fine of up to £2500/tree)
