- Scouts have asked for between £100-£300 for their ‘old’ tent. Agreed to purchase it for £150: Roger will arrange collection and temporary storage. Then we can decide what is best for longer term storage.
- Film Shows. Last year 21 films were shown. For the past two years the projection equipment has been set up and dismantled each time. While it doesn’t take much time, it would be very useful if an additional person could volunteer to help the showing of films. Agreed that we’ll have 2 films a month until end of May, and resume in September. This three month pause was agreed. A small ‘Film Selection’ group will be choosing films for the next three months.
